Sir,

In conformity with Article 4 of the Regulations of the Foundation for the Award of the Darling Medal and Prize, I have the honour to inform you that the interest on the Foundation's capital amounts to a sufficient sum for a prize to be awarded. Therefore, I have pleasure in inviting you to put forward, if you so wish, the name of a person whom you think worthy of being considered for ... this Award. A copy of the Regulations, as amended on 28 May 1979, is attached for your easy reference.

It will be noted that the Prize, consisting of a bronze medal and the sum of one thousand Swiss francs, will be awarded "for outstanding achievements in the pathology, etiology, epidemiology, therapy, prophylaxis or control of malaria" (Article 2), that "the candidature must be in respect of a work published or accomplished not more than ten years before its submission or citation to the Organization" and that "No conditions are made as to age, sex, profession, nationality, race or religion of candidates" (Article 5).

In accordance with Article 6 of the Regulations, all nominations will be submitted to the Expert Committee on Malaria, which will be held from 7 to 14 June 1995. If you intend to put forward a candidature, I should be grateful if you would communicate to me your nomination, accompanied by a written statement of the reason on which it is based, within the prescribed period, i.e., by 10 February 1995 (six months as from the date of this C.L.) (Article 5).

Please accept, Sir, the assurance of my highest consideration.
