HEALTH ORGANISATION.

Financial Regulations concerning the Scholarships granted
for the Malaria Courses.

1. A subsistence allowance of 20 Swiss francs a day is granted during participation in the course and also for the return journey (by the quickest route).

Second class railway travel from place of residence to the town where the Course is being held is reimbursed, including couchette for indispensable night journeys; the same applies to travelling expenses for the return journey at the end of the Course; also petty expenses such as those for taxis and luggage are reimbursed. Tips are not included. The journeys necessitated by the field work are a charge on the Institute where the course is being held.

For medical officers whose journeys involve a long sea voyage, only the cost of travel from the port of arrival in Europe and return to that port is paid.

A travelling claim form is sent to the recipient of a scholarship who is asked to complete and return it to the "Medical Director, Health Section, League of Nations, Geneva" on arrival in the town where the course is taking place.

An advance representing the subsistence allowance for the first month is sent to the medical Officer before his departure. As regards travelling expenses, the amount is paid on receipt in Geneva of his claim for reimbursement.

In the meantime these expenses are covered by means of the advance sent to him.
