Pèlerinage de La Mecque

Selon des informations reçues de l'administration sanitaire d'Arabie Saoudite, le nombre des pèlerins réunis au mont Arafat le 26 juin (jour d'Arafat) s'est élevé à environ six cent mille. Les 26, 27 et 28 juin (1^{er} et 2^{me} jours de Mona) 185 décès ont été enregistrés, dont 107 par insolation, les autres étant attribuables à la sénilité, la débilité, ou des affections banales diverses. Aucun cas de maladie quarantenaire n'ayant été observé, le pèlerinage a été déclaré indemne, le 30 juin, par l'administration sanitaire d'Arabie Saoudite.

Mecca Pilgrimage

According to information received from the Saudi Arabian health administration, the number of pilgrims meeting at Mount Arafat on 26th June (Arafat Day) was about six hundred thousand. On 26, 27 and 28 June (first and second Mona Days) 185 deaths have been registered, 107 of which were due to sunstroke, the others being due to senility, debility or caused by common diseases. No case of quarantinable disease being reported, the pilgrimage was declared free from infection on 30 June by the administration of Saudi Arabia.
