INFORMATIONS ÉPIDÉMIOLOGIQUES — EPIDEMIOLOGICAL NOTES

GRIPPE

Les infections d'allure grippale qui sont signalées sous forme d'épidémies plus ou moins étendues dans les pays de l'Hémisphère Nord, restent partout bénignes. Très peu d'entre-elles sont attribuables aux virus grippaux du type A et notamment au sous-groupe A2 responsable de la dernière pandémie. Le type B par contre est largement prévalent. En divers pays les infections à adénovirus paraissent être presque aussi nombreuses. Le virus C a été signalé comme une rareté. Les enfants sont atteints plus fréquemment que les adultes.

Amérique

Aux *Etats-Unis* une souche de type C a été isolée au Michigan. Tant dans cet Etat cependant que dans le district de Columbia c'est le type B qui a été rencontré jusqu'ici dans la grande majorité des cas. Une maladie, d'allure grippale, mais d'étiologie non précisée encore, provoque un absentéisme marqué dans les Comtés d'Essex et Middlesex (Massachusetts).

INFLUENZA

Influenza-like infections reported in the form of more or less severe outbreaks in the Northern Hemisphere, remain mild. Very few are caused by influenza virus A or by the A2 virus which was responsible of the last pandemic. On the other hand, virus B is mostly prevalent. In various countries, adenovirus infections seem to be as numerous. Virus C was rarely notified. Children are more frequently affected than adults.

America

In the *United States* a C-type strain has been isolated in Michigan. However, in this State as well as in the District of Columbia, type-B virus has been prevalent. An influenza-like disease has provoked marked absenteeism in the Counties of Essex and Middlesex (Massachusetts), but its etiology has not yet been defined.

Asie

Japan. — Un virus A-2 vient d'être isolé au cours d'une petite épidémie localisée à un hôpital psychiatrique dans le voisinage de Tokyo. Aucune autre poussée de grippe n'est signalée jusqu'à présent.

Europe

Allemagne (République fédérale d'). — Au cours des dernières semaines le nombre des infections des voies respiratoires s'est accru à Berlin. Dans deux cas (dont un mortel) les examens sérologiques ont permis d'incriminer un virus B.

En *Autriche* le nombre des cas de grippe enregistrés au cours des dernières semaines s'est élevé à :

Du 7 au 14 février, plus de la moitié des cas ont été observés en Basse Autriche (1381). La mortalité est pratiquement nulle.

Danemark. — L'épidémie de grippe B s'accroît: 2300 cas ont été enregistrés du 15 au 21 février contre 1000 environ pendant la semaine précédente.

France. — La grippe continue à se manifester dans l'ensemble du pays. L'absentéisme scolaire est particulièrement marqué dans le Jura et le Gers.

Grèce. — L'accroissement de la fréquence des affections de l'appareil respiratoire ne dépasse pas le niveau saisonnier habituel. Un virus A2 a été isolé au cours d'une poussée de grippe bénigne localisée à une école professionnelle près d'Athènes.

Royaume-Uni. — En Angleterre et au Pays de Galles le nombre de décès attribuables à la grippe et à la pneumonie grippale au cours des dernières semaines a été de :

Le total (782) est inférieur à celui de l'année 1958 (1455) mais supérieur à celui de 1957 (171).

Suède. — Du 5 au 14 février l'absentéisme scolaire à Stockholm a été très important. Depuis le début du mois l'affection s'étend graduellement aux adultes. Aucun indice de l'existence de la grippe A (Asiatique ou autre) n'a été observé en Suède jusqu'à présent. Les infections à adénovirus sont fréquentes à côté des cas de grippe B.

Suisse. — Le nombre de cas notifiés continue à s'accroître en Suisse (6952 du 15 au 21 février contre 6069 la semaine précédente), surtout dans les cantons de Zurich, Berne, Lucerne, Glaris, Zoug, Appenzell, St. Gall, Grisons, Argovie, Thurgovie et Neuchâtel. La présence du virus B a été décelée dans plusieurs régions.

Tchécoslovaquie. La morbidité attribuée à la grippe s'est accrue depuis la mi-février, dans certains districts de ce pays. Des souches B ont été isolées en décembre et en janvier.

Yougoslavie. — Plusieurs souches de type B ont été isolées en Serbie. La sérologie permet d'attribuer à la grippe B plusieurs poussées d'affections aiguës des voies respiratoires observées en Serbie, Dalmatie et Bosnie au cours des trois premières semaines de février. Des agents infectieux autres que le virus grippal sont aussi en cause mais n'ont pas encore été identifiés.

Asia

Japan. — During a mild outbreak in a psychiatric hospital near Tokyo, an A-2 virus has recently been isolated. To date, no other influenza outbreak has been reported.

Europe

Germany (Federal Republic of). — During the last few weeks, the number of respiratory infections has been increasing in Berlin. Serological examination of two cases (of which one was fatal) revealed that the infections was due to virus B.

In *Austria* the number of cases reported during the last few week was:

From 7 to 14 February, more than half of them were reported in South-Austria (1381). Mortality is practically nil.

Denmark. — The influenza-B epidemic is increasing: 2300 cases were reported from 15 to 21 February as against about 1000 during the preceding week.

France. — Influenza is still present throughout the country. School absences are particularly numerous in the Departments of Jura and Gers.

Greece. — Respiratory infection incidence is no higher than in previous years at the same season. An A2 virus was isolated during a mild influenza outbreak in a professional school near Athens.

United Kingdom. — In England and Wales, the number of deaths due to influenzal pneumonia, during the last few weeks was:

This total (782) is lower than that of 1958, (1455) but higher than that of 1957 (171).

Sweden. — From 5 to 14 February school absences were numerous in Stockholm. Since the beginning of the month the affection is spreading amongst adults. To date no evidence of an A-type influenza (Asiatic or otherwise) has been found in the country. Adenovirus infections seem to be prevalent simultaneously with influenza B.

Switzerland. — The number of cases reported is still increasing particularly in the cantons of Zurich, Bern, Luzern, Glarus, Zug, Appenzell, St. Gallen, Graubünden, Aargau, Thurgau and Neuchâtel (6952 from 15 to 21 February as against 6069 during the preceding week). The presence of virus B was found in several regions.

Czechoslovakia. — Influenza morbidity has been increasing since mid-February in some districts of the country. B-strains were isolated in December and January.

Yugoslavia. — Several B-strains were isolated in Serbia; during the first three weeks of February several acute respiratory infections, serologically revealed to be due to influenza B, were reported in Serbia, Dalmatia and Bosnia. The rest was caused by agents other than influenza, but have not yet been identified.
